All work is documented within a sketchbook as well as development pieces and final responses outside of the book. Students' gain key observational skills through visiting Kew Gardens to gather vital research and drawings.</p>	<p>Students will be assessed at various points throughout the two years.</p> <p>Their first assessment is part of their Natural Forms project. They are assessed on two final responses including a screen print and a wire sculpture.</p> <p>Alongside these responses students' sketchbooks are assessed throughout the course and contribute to their final grade.</p>
