Year 11	Students are required to develop knowledge, understanding and skills relevant to their chosen title through practical, critical and contextual study that encourages direct engagement with original works and practice. Students may work in any medium or combination of media. They can work entirely in digital media or entirely non-digital media, or in a mixture of both, provided the aims and assessment objectives are met. Students must learn through practical experience and demonstrate knowledge and understanding of sources that inform their creative intentions. Intentions should be realised through purposeful engagement with visual language, visual concepts, media, materials and the application of appropriate techniques and working methods.
