Doing

- Research your family tree in the nineteenth and twentieth century and consider how this has changed and stayed the same over time.
- Research primary sources from the Vietnam War (this could be a photograph/news reel etc) – what does this tell us about that time in American history? Don't forget to consider the provenance.
- Consider how history has been interpreted in the past by looking at historical accounts of events in the Cold War, Vietnam War and Civil Rights Movement in the USA
