Whitechapel 1870-1900: The Historical Environment –

Crime and Punishment through time:

C1000- present

A thematic, chronological study of how the nature of crime, punishment and policing changed in Britain from c1000-present

Weimar and Nazi Germany 1918-1939

Following the establishment of the Weimar republic after WW, students will examine in depth how the problems of the republic led to the establishment of Hitler's dictatorship



Revision of Whitechapel

Weekly revision tasks through the use of homework's and recap and recall questions.



Revision of Weimar Germany

Revision of the Weimar republic and the problems which it faced will take place to ensure students can thus understand how Hitler formed the third Reich.
