

# The Novel

Start

Students study 19<sup>th</sup> C text 'Great Expectations' and develop understanding of characters, use of setting, structure and symbolism.

## Assessment

Writing assessment based on a non fiction prompt. Skills from weekly writing tasks will be used.

#### Writing tasks Spring 1

Once a week will focus on dystopian fiction. Each task runs over two weeks to allow time for redrafting and a focus on vocabulary

## Travel writing

A range of extracts will be studied inc. Robinson Crusoe, Gulliver's Travels etc. Focus on viewpoints, register, tone and comparison of texts.

## Drama

Romeo & Julietbuilding understanding of Shakespearian language and characterisation. Year 8 English

#### Writing tasksthroughout the year

Once a week students write fiction and non fiction pieces using the 250 word challenge model. Each task runs over two weeks to allow time for redrafting (TRIO) and a focus on vocabulary

## Diverse shorts

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End

Students will study a range of short stories on diverse topics and develop understanding of character and theme.

## Teacher Assessment

Short questions on dystopia genre and a dystopia narrative.

## Assessment

The summer exam will be based on a Romeo and Juliet extract

## Frankenstein

Students will read the Phillip Pullman play script and some extracts of the original novel, with a focus on morality.
