Appearance and Uniform

Our uniform proudly displays the Gunnersbury Community that our students are part of. Correctly wearing the uniform and adhering to our appearance policy are integral to being a student of Gunnersbury Catholic School. The Gunnersbury dress code is underpinned by the following principles:

- To promote the sense of togetherness and belonging within our Catholic community
- To maintain the foci of all on learning and personal development
- To promote equality amongst our students

Students must be in full uniform and complying with the appearance requirements at all times when: on site; in a consortium school; they travel to and from school; on school trips (unless advised otherwise by staff). The manner in which students comport themselves has a considerable effect on the ethos of the whole school and our reputation beyond the school. Our pastoral system and teams will maintain the observance of our appearance and uniform requirements by our students.

Uniform Years 7-11

Appearance Requirements Years 7-11

- 1. Pupils are always to be of smart appearance, avoiding extremes of fashion.
- 2. Full School uniform is to be worn to and from school, within school and for school based activities. Unless otherwise directed by a member of staff, rules regarding school uniform and appearance must be followed.
- 3. Outdoor clothing is not to be worn inside the school buildings. Hats are not allowed inside the school buildings. The school hat is the only permitted headwear and may only be worn outside during periods of cold weather (as determined by the Deputy Headteacher).
- 4. Hair must be of a style that is conventional and understated. Hair should:

not be bleached, coloured, permed or chemically altered in any manner

not be closely cropped/shaved or with significant differences in length about the head e.g. the hair on top of the head is significantly longer than that at the sides

be without patterns, lines or partings etc. cut/shaved into it

Extremes of haircut/styling will not be allowed as they can distract from our central

purpose of pupil development and learning.

- 5. Shaving of eyebrows (e.g. cutting lines into them) is not acceptable.
- 6. Tattoos are strictly forbidden. No pupil shall be allowed to attend Gunnersbury with a tattoo, even if it is covered by an elastoplast dressing or similar.

7.	ewellery must not be worn in school (or on school occasions) nor on the journey to and from school. Ear/nose ngs and studs, bracelets, finger rings, necklaces, chains are all included in this requirement.					

Sixth Form Uniform

Detailed below are the items of clothing that form our required uniform for all students within the Sixth Form. Alternative and/or additional items are not permitted to be worn to Gunnersbury Catholic School.

Sixth Formers should wear **smart, conventional business attire** that is professional in style, pattern or colour, consisting of:

Sixth Form Appearance Requirements

Sixth Formers are expected to set an example to other students and provide positive role models. At Gunnersbury we encourage senior students to take pride in their appearance and dress. This entails:

- 1. A dark, sober coloured, plain coat without any visible branding may be worn over the suit jacket for travel to and from school but must not be worn during the school day at any time. Denim, leather jackets and hoodies are not permissible.
- 2. Suit jackets must be worn at all times when Sixth Form students are moving around the school. 6th Form ID Badge to be worn at all times.
- **3.** Shoes must be polishable, flat or with a low heel and in a conventional, business style. Desert boots or suede shoes are not permitted
- **4.** Sleeveless/strappy tops, low necklines or shirts/blouses with pictures, slogans or logos are not permissible
- 5. No visible make-up
- **6.** Tattoos are strictly forbidden. No pupil shall be allowed to attend Gunnersbury with a tattoo, even if it is covered by an elastoplast dressing or similar.
- 7. Jewellery and facial adornment are not permitted beyond a pair of discreet earrings (one per ear)
- **8.** Extreme haircuts, as determined by the Director of Sixth Form, are not allowed. It may not be bleached, dyed, tinted or highlighted to change its natural colouration.
- 9. Patterns and lines may not be cut/shaved etc into a pupil's eyebrows

10. The following items are NOT to be worn: denim and denim derivatives, sweatshirts, hooded tops and jumpers, tee shirts or patterned tops, trainers, sports shoes or pumps, canvas shoes or headgear11. Extremes of fashion or trends (dress and haircut) are not permitted

Second Hand Uniform
