These can be found on the homework sheet.</p> <p>Pupils will sit an assessment at the end of the unit which will contain an A, B, C and D part question to assess their knowledge, understanding and ability to evaluate the topics covered.</p>
<p><b>Autumn Half Term 2</b></p>	<p><u>Unit 2: Prophecy and Promise</u></p> <p>The overall objective of Unit 2 is to introduce the pupils to the idea of what a Christian scripture and its role in the life of Catholics.</p>	<p>Students will study topics which include; What is scripture and sacred tradition, structure of the Bible, Bible translations, cannon of scripture, authority of the Bible.</p> <p>Key words include; Dei Verbum, scripture, tradition, magisterium, inspired, canon, Old Testament, New Testament, Hebrew, Aramaic, Greek, Tanakh, Liturgy of the Word.</p>	<p>Homework tasks will be set each week which directly relate to the lessons. These can be found on the homework sheet.</p> <p>The assessment will contain an A, B, C and D part question to assess their knowledge, understanding and ability to evaluate the topics covered.</p>
<p><b>Spring Half Term 1</b></p>	<p><u>Unit 3: Galilee to Jerusalem</u></p> <p>Unit 3 aims to bring pupils to a greater understanding of Jesus as both fully human and fully divine.</p>	<p>This unit explores core Catholic beliefs about Jesus as the final revelation of God, the Incarnation, the Trinity, key heresies and the Nicene Creed, the titles of Jesus, Trinitarian art and prayer, and how Jesus' life models human dignity in light of Catholic Social Teaching.</p> <p>Key words include; Incarnation, Trinity, Son of Man, Son of God, Christ, Lord, heresy, arianism, lex orandi, lex credenda, service.</p>	<p>Homework tasks will be set each week which directly relate to the lessons. These can be found on the homework sheet.</p> <p>The assessment will contain an A, B, C and D part question to assess their knowledge, understanding and ability to evaluate the topics covered.</p>
<p><b>Spring Half Term 2</b></p>	<p><u>Unit 4: Desert to Garden</u></p> <p>The overall objective of Unit 4 is to allow pupils to come to a deeper understanding of the practices of the Catholic faith with regards to Sacraments and Eucharist in particular.</p>	<p>This unit explores Christian worship and Sacraments. Students will study; The Sacraments, The Paschal Mystery; Exodus &amp; The Last Supper, transubstantiation, Liturgy of the Eucharist.</p> <p>Key words include; Paschal mystery, sacrament, Passover, Eucharist, Sacrifice of the Mass, transubstantiation, Holy Communion, Lord's Supper, Blessed Sacrament.</p>	<p>Homework tasks will be set each week which directly relate to the lessons. These can be found on the homework sheet.</p> <p>Pupils will sit an assessment at the end of the unit which will contain an A, B, C and D part question to assess their knowledge, understanding and ability to evaluate the topics covered.</p>
<p><b>Summer Half Term 1</b></p>	<p><u>Unit 5: To the ends of the Earth</u></p> <p>Unit 5 aims to bring pupils to a greater understanding of The Holy spirit and birth of the Church.</p>	<p>Students will delve further into role of the Holy Spirit in the life of Christians, exploring; The Holy Spirit, Holy Spirit in the New Testament, Pentecost, Titles of the Church, Confirmation.</p> <p>Key words include; Holy Spirit, Pentecost, ruah, people of God, Body of Christ, temple of the Holy Spirit, confirmation, fruits of the Spirit.</p>	<p>Homework tasks will be set each week which directly relate to the lessons. They will explore; Councils of the Church, The Council of Trent, Christian denominations, how do different denominations worship God, what is the Body of Christ, challenges of ecumenism. In the second half of the unit students will learn about the antient religion of Buddhism.</p> <p>Key words include; Ecumenical council, schism, dogma, reform, Christian unity, ecumenism, Buddha, Dukkha, Anatta, The Sangha, Reincarnation, Karma, Enlightenment, Nirvana, Temple, Meditation.</p>	<p>Homework tasks will be set each week which directly relate to the lessons.
